

Chem 360 Final Exam Review Guide

The 50-point final exam is on June 9, Wednesday, at 8-10:30 am, PS 155 (same room).

This review guide is meant to help you focus your review but not to limit it. Use it as a starting point.

Review the following:

- 1) all the quizzes (there were 4).
- 2) all the homework exercises.
- 3) all the group exercises.

- 4) Finally, re-read the chapters assigned in the textbook.

As explained in the last lecture, the final exam will be similar to the quizzes, except of course, longer.

The types of questions will involve the various sections (i.e. IMRD + abstract+ references + title) of a scientific journal (not posters) and may include:

- 1) Editing sentences to make them more concise, more professional, more appropriate for given sections in a scientific journal.
- 2) Identifying the appropriate sections (and subsections of those sections) to place a set of given sentences.
- 3) Knowing the moves, submoves and purposes of various sections. (note: Some seem to confuse the Results and Discussion).
- 4) Know the various genres mentioned in the first chapter of the book and be able to distinguish them in general. How do their sentences differ? Can you figure it out from reading given sentences?

Note: The final exam will also ask you to objectively and critically rate your peer group mates. Make sure you know their names by heart and that you are neither overly generous nor overly strict in your rating. For example, being overly generous will lower YOUR grade.
